# Campaign for Sustainability

This fall, LLI at Virginia Tech is launching a campaign for future sustainability. Now in its seventh year, LLI has become an important part of the quality of life for 50+ adults and retirees in the New River Valley and beyond. We have come to cherish the lively lectures, passionate instructors, and great conversations with other members. Our goal now is to make sure that these opportunities continue into the future.

While VT Continuing and Professional Education (CPE) provided partial financial support as we launched LLI, we are expected to fully cover our costs, including the costs of services provided by CPE. We have met this expectation in the last several terms by reducing costs of catalog printing and rental of venues, and depending heavily on volunteers. While volunteers will always be a part of LLI, we need to chart a path that leads to more professional staffing if we hope to sustain and grow a vibrant program.



## Sept 24. Independence Corrupted: How America's Judges Really Make Their **Decisions**

Judge Schudson understands how judges really make their decisions. In his book and teaching, he explores the personal, professional, and political pressures threatening judicial integrity like never before.

Charles Benjamin Schudson is a Wisconsin Reserve Judge Emeritus and law professor. He is the author of *Independence* Corrupted: How America's Judges Make Their Decisions, a nominee for the 2018 National Book Award.

# Oct 1. Shenandoah National Park: Natural **History Highlights**

Naturalist Keith Tomlinson covers the big picture, from geological origins to present-day conservation efforts, providing an intimate appreciation for the unique natural history of Shenandoah National Park.

Keith Tomlinson managed Meadowlark Botanical Gardens in Vienna, Virginia from 1998 to 2020 before his retirement. He worked as an interpretive naturalist and natural resource manager over forty years and studied wilderness areas and botanical gardens in Asia, the Pacific, Africa, Australia, the Americas, and Europe.

# Oct 8. Mosaic for Earth: Celebrating Nature through Music and the Visual Arts

Bigler's original composition, Mosaic for Earth, weaves together music, literature, visual arts, and science to celebrate the wonders of nature and explore humanity's impact on the environment. Bigler will talk about his creative process in advance of the March 29 premiere at the Moss Arts Center.

**Dwight Bigler**, Virginia Tech Director of Choral Activities, has degrees in choral conducting and piano performance.
